- Outstanding Service Award
 - —The nominee must be a TCSGC member at the time of nomination
 - —The nominee must have been a TCSGC member for a sustained period of time and have made significant contributions to TCSGC over the period
- Technical Achievement Award
 - —The nominee must be a TCSGC member at the time of nomination
 - -The nominee must have done outstanding technical work in the field of the TCSGC
 - —The nominee must have achieved a high degree of visibility for the work and for TCSGC in the community





Selection criteria

Outstanding Service Award:

- Distinguished record of service to the TCSGC community, including organization of TCSGC endorsed symposia and workshops
- Providing exceptional leadership within the TCSGC
- Promotion of TCSGC activities and interests in the TCSGC research community

Technical Achievement Award

- Involvement with the TCSGC
- Outstanding technical work in the field of the TCSGC
- High degree of visibility for his/her work and for TCSGC in the community.
